

## Tip # 16 –The TEASys at one Glance

By using the [Tübingen Explanatory Annotation System](#), we aim at providing annotations that are helpful for the **highest possible number of readers**. They should be able to choose **how much information** and also **what kind** of information they wish to receive. For this, we have developed the **Levels** and **Category** system:

### A) Levels

With our system, readers may choose how much they want to read/ where to start reading in accordance with their demands and interests.

Each annotation can have three levels; but not every annotation needs to have three levels. The minimum is one.

**Level 1:** basic information for text comprehension

**Level 2:** further information, based on information presented on level 1

**Level 3:** more advanced information, based on information presented on levels 1 and 2

### B) Categories

On our website, it is possible to **filter** annotations by category. Each level is subdivided into one or several categories. There are eight different categories of annotation:

**1) Language:** explains the meaning of words and phrases (e.g. archaic words, ambiguity, idioms)

**2) Form:** draws attention to the literariness of the text (e.g. poetic devices, rhyme scheme, narrative structure)

**3) Intratextuality:** analyses the relation of a word/passage to the rest of the primary text (e.g. motifs, repetitions, foreshadowing)

**4) Intertextuality:** identifies and analyses a text's references to other texts and works of art

**5) Context:** background information on Cultural, historical, biographical, political, religious, philosophical, scientific, etc. context

**6) Interpretation:** draws conclusions from other categories concerning the meaning of a word/passage/ text

**7) Textual Variants:** differences between versions of the primary text

**8) Questions:** documents or problems and the sources we have already consulted in order to solve them; encourages readers to contribute their findings
